

WHAT IS VDSS?

VDSS (VET- Vocational Education and Training - Delivered to Secondary Students) is the acronym for what is more commonly known as VET. A program that is designed to provide you with a practical approach to learning, teaching you knowledge and specific skills to help you in the workplace.

- VDSS programs can be undertaken as part of secondary school studies. VDSS programs offer students nationally or state recognised vocational certificate which are endorsed for recognition in the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major (VCE VM) or the Victorian Pathway Certificate (VPC) from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA).
- Students enrolled in VDSS may also combine study and employment through School to Work programs while they undertake their senior secondary studies.



QUALIFICATION

Standalone Qualification

As well as being part of your secondary studies, VDSS is a qualification in it's own right and can be used as part of a person's employment journey. Students are issued with either a Certificate II or III at the completion of their course with Skillinvest, unless stated otherwise.

Practical

While all study involves a theory component including written assessment requirements, Skillinvest VDSS courses are different in that they are highly practical and assessments are completed on a students ability to perform practical skills. This means that many assessments are completed on what you can demonstrate rather than what you can write about.





AGRICULTURE

AHC20122 Certificate II in Agriculture

The AHC20122 Certificate II in Agriculture is delivered both on and off the job in a partnership arrangement between Longerenong College, businesses and participating schools and normally takes two years to complete.

The aim of the program is to provide participants with skills in a range of industries which will lead on to further study or will enhance opportunities for employment in a range of industries including intensive animal production, broadacre cropping and agribusiness.

As a part of our Agriculture package we also include a selection of specialised skills units giving students a bonus pack of units at the conclusion of their course.

AUTOMOTIVE

AUR20720 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation

Skillinvest's AUR20720 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation is different. In addition to the regular units we deliver some units on the diesel engine. Students will finish with a Certificate in Automotive however you will also have a unit specific to diesel engines as a bonus. This will enhance your ability to transition into work at the conclusion of your schooling.

This program will assist students to perform a range of tasks on a diesel engine and associated systems in the automotive retail, service and repair industry. This program aims to enable students to develop a range of skills appropriate to entry level positions in the industry and to apply known solutions to predictable problems associated with diesel engines.





WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

HOW TO APPLY

Students will be able to apply to study a VDSS course after they have consulted with their school VET or Careers Coordinator.

Applications open towards the end of term three or the beginning of term four. See your school VET or Careers Coordinator for more details.

UNIQUE STUDENT IDENTIFIER (USI)

A USI is your lifelong education number – you only need to create it once. If you do not already have a USI you will need to create one before commencing your VDSS course.

START TIME AND DATES

Start time and dates will be communicated to students through their school VET Coordinators and via a welcome letter from Skillinvest once a student applies.

EXPECTATIONS

Students will be expected to follow all instructions given to them by Skillinvest staff and adhere to the Skillinvest Student Code of Conduct.

VDSS is an adult course modified for students and as such, students are expected to behave appropriately at all times.

A full list of expectations, along with the Skillinvest Students Code of Conduct will be provided to students via the Skillinvest Handbook prior to enrolling.

BREAK TIMES

Break times will be determined by the individual trainer for each course to fit in with the scheduling for the day. Times may vary from week to week depending on units being delivered and the site students are studying at.

PHONES AND DEVICES

Phones and devices are to be placed in students bags and not accessed during VDSS classes unless or until they are required. The course trainer will let students know when they can access their phone or device, and only then can they be used during class time.

SMOKING/VAPING

Skillinvest and all sites we deliver on are strictly no smoking/vaping sites. Students are not permitted to smoke or vape on site with no exceptions.


TRAVEL
